Over 5,000 Missouri State Government Publications Now in Internet Archive

The Reference Services Division of the Missouri State Library in Jefferson City has over 5,000 Missouri state government publications housed in Internet Archive as part of the [State Publications Access Program](#). The collection can be found at [Missouri State Publications](#).

These publications represent every executive department as well as all six statewide elected offices and the General Assembly. Many more publications will be added in the coming months. Individual titles in Internet Archive are indexed by Google, and there are multiple ways to view them, including desktop viewer, PDF, EPUB, Kindle, Daisy and plain text.

Funding for Courier Service Transfer Center

State Librarian Barbara Reading has announced that LSTA grant funding to the Mid-America Library Alliance (MALA) has been increased to cover the cost of a transfer center for library materials

between the MALA public library courier, FirstChoice and the MOBIUS academic library courier, STAT. The transfer center is needed so that library materials can continue to be exchanged seamlessly between public and academic libraries. Prior to July 1, both MALA and MOBIUS used the FirstChoice courier. Libraries should be receiving guidance soon from MALA and MOBIUS about how this transfer center will be implemented.

Multiple Outlet Hours Calculator Tool

The Library Research Service of the Colorado State Library has developed a [Multiple Outlet Hours Calculator tool](#) to count hours for libraries. This can be used to answer questions 2.24 regarding “Total Outlet Hours/Week” and 2.28 regarding “Total Outlet Hours per Year” on the Public Library Survey (if hours are the same year-round). The daily entries should be in the hours, minutes, and a.m./p.m. format (i.e. 8:00 a.m.) and each outlet can be named for easy tracking. To add more than one outlet, simply click on the “Add Another Outlet” link.

Librarian411: Improving Service for People with Disabilities on December 17 from 10-11 a.m.

Approximately one in five adults and one in 10 children have a condition that meets the criteria for mental illness. Nearly four million Americans have developmental disabilities that have an impact on their ability to participate in everyday community activities. Self-advocates, their families and professionals agree that information is important for the management of mental illness and for the enrichment of the lives of individuals who face these challenges. Library workers are uniquely placed to assist in the search for reliable information. Libraries offer many services and opportunities that might otherwise be unavailable to these populations.

This webinar will examine beliefs and biases regarding disabilities and provide practical tips about serving customers with different needs. Participants will explore training and other resources available on the Librarian411 website. The presenter is Tonya Hays-Martin, librarian at Fulton State

Hospital. She has worked in the mental health field for 22 years. Fulton State Hospital Library serves both professional staff and clients with severe and persistent mental illness. Tonya was instrumental in developing the web-based training program, Librarian411.
