

WHEREAS, protection of the safety and welfare of the citizens of the state requires an invocation of the provisions of Sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MATT BLUNT, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Missouri, including Sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, do hereby declare that a state of emergency exists in the State of Missouri. I do hereby direct that the Missouri State Emergency Operations Plan be activated.

I further authorize the use of state agencies to provide assistance, as needed.

This order shall terminate on January 7, 2008, unless extended in whole or in part.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 07-35

WHEREAS, I have been advised by the Director of the State Emergency Management Agency that severe winter storm systems causing damages associated with snow, freezing rain, sleet and ice have impacted communities across the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, interruption of public services is occurring as a result of the severe weather that began on December 8, 2007, and continues; and

WHEREAS, the resources of the State of Missouri may be needed to assist affected jurisdictions and to help relieve the condition of distress and hazard to the safety and welfare of Missourians; and

WHEREAS, protection of the safety and welfare of the citizens of the state requires an invocation of the provisions of Sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MATT BLUNT, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Missouri, including Section 41.480.2, RSMo, order and direct the Adjutant General of the State of Missouri, or his designee, to forthwith call and order into active service such portions of the organized militia as he deems necessary to aid the executive officials of Missouri and to protect life and property. It is further ordered and directed that the Adjutant General or his designee, and through him, the commanding officer of any unit or other organization of such organized militia so called into active service take such action and employ such equipment as may be necessary in support of civilian authorities, and provide such assistance as may be authorized by the Governor of this State.

This order shall terminate on January 7, 2008, unless extended in whole or in part.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 07-36

WHEREAS, I have been advised by the Director of the Missouri State Emergency Management Agency that a natural disaster of significant proportions has occurred in Missouri, which has been affected by severe weather; and

WHEREAS, the severe winter weather that began on December 8, 2007, and continuing has created a condition of distress and hazards to the safety and welfare of the citizens of the State of Missouri beyond the capabilities of some local jurisdictions and other established agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources is charged by law with protecting and enhancing the quality of Missouri's environment and with enforcing a variety of environmental rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, to respond to the emergency and to expedite the cleanup and recovery process, it is necessary to adjust certain environmental rules and regulations on a temporary and short-term basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MATT BLUNT, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Chapter 44, RSMo, do hereby issue the following order:

The Director of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources is vested with full discretionary authority to temporarily waive or suspend the operation of any statutory or administrative rule or regulation currently in place under his purview in order to best serve the interest of the public health and safety during the period of the emergency and the subsequent recovery period.

This order shall terminate on January 7, 2008, unless extended in whole or in part.

EMERGENCY DECLARATION

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, November 27, 2007, an accident involving a commercial motor vehicle hauling a highly flammable liquid occurred on U.S. Route 54 in Jefferson City, Missouri. The accident caused the liquid to spill onto the above-mentioned highway and caught fire, severely damaging State Bridge No. A1308, more commonly referred to as the Jefferson Street Overpass, a bridge that is eligible to receive federal aid funds; and

WHEREAS, the severe damage to the Jefferson Street Overpass was caused by the extreme heat generated by the flammable liquid that caught fire on U.S. Route 54, which compromised the structural integrity, more specifically the reinforcing steel, of the Jefferson Street Overpass, resulting in the need to completely remove and replace the overpass. Repair of the overpass is not possible; and

WHEREAS, the loss of the Jefferson Street Overpass as a transportation link over U.S. Route 54 will have a very negative impact to the businesses and individuals in the immediate area. Such conditions constitute an emergency as is contemplated by the provisions in Title 23, United States Code Annotated, Sections 1209(e) and 125, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the safety and welfare of the motorists using U.S. Route 54 also has been compromised as a result of the severe damage to the structural integrity of the Jefferson Street Overpass; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, MATT BLUNT, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby declare that an emergency exists concerning the damage to the Jefferson Street Overpass and consequent danger to the traveling public if the overpass is not removed and replaced, which is vital to the security, well-being and health of the citizens of Jefferson City, Missouri, as well as all motorist that use U.S. Route 54 located underneath the Jefferson Street Overpass; and

FURTHER, I hereby request that the Federal Highway Administration, Division Administrator-Missouri, concur in this declaration of emergency; and

FURTHER, I direct that this Emergency Declaration shall become effective immediately upon signature and shall continue in effect until the Jefferson Street Overpass has been removed and replaced.
