

In the Circuit Court of Ray County Monday, 3^d March Term, 1869.

The Honorable Austin M. King has produced his Commission as Judge of the fifth Judicial Circuit in the State of Missouri, under the great Seal of the State, subscribed by William P. Hall, acting Governor of the State of Missouri, and countersigned by M. Oliver, Secretary of State, ^{dated the 17th day of January, 1862} with his oath of Office thereon endorsed, and thereupon the said Austin M. King takes his seat as the Judge of this Court, and said Court is opened by proclamation, present, the said Austin M. King Judge, John C. Cates, Sheriff and Robert Sevier, Clerk.

It is here Ordered by the Court, that the Order made by this Court, on the 17th day of September, A. D. 1859, requiring the Grand and Petit Jurors in this Court, to be summoned, empanelled and paid according to Article Second of an Act, entitled an Act concerning Grand and Petit Jurors, approved December 5th 1858, be and the same is hereby rescinded, and that Grand and Petit Jurors in this Court, be hereafter summoned, empanelled and paid in accordance with the provisions of Article first of the Act aforesaid.

The Clerk of this Court, here administers in open Court and before any Jury is empanelled, to John C. Cates, Sheriff of Ray County, and George C. Hance and John C. Cates, or he and his only deputies, the oath prescribed by Law.

Narcis S. Whitmer, here produces before the Court, his Commission as Circuit Attorney of the fifth Judicial Circuit in the State of Missouri, under the Great Seal of the State, subscribed by William P. Hall, acting Governor of the State of Missouri, and countersigned by M. Oliver, Secretary of State dated the first day of February A. D. 1869, with his oath of Office thereon endorsed.
