## **E-rate Reform Message from MOREnet**

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) announced an agreement to partner in delivering schools and libraries the opportunity to save money on wireless access points, routers and the other equipment needed to deploy robust Wi-Fi networks for educational technology. This opportunity will be available for e-rate applicants in Funding Year 2015 (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016).
