A message from the Senate by Mr. Williams:

Mr. Speaker:

I am instructed to say that the Senate have passed the following resolutions, in which they ask the concurrence of the House of Representatives.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of the Senate the House of Representatives, concurring therein that it is improper for any member or any reporter of the proceedings in either House to take statements reports communications or extracts from them of any official documents in relation to the difficulties with the people called Mormons for the purpose of publication in any public Journal until a final action of the Legislature upon that subject.

On motion of Mr. Geyer,

The bill entitled an act concerning writs of forcible entries and Detainers was taken up, and recommitted to the committee of the whole House.

On motion of Mr. Emmons,

The House adjourned.

The resolution from the Senate, forbidding the publication of the documents accompanying the Governor's message, in relation to the Mormon difficulties, Was taken up, and agreed to.

An act supplementary to an act to organise Clark county,

An act for the relief of Charles Seavers, and

An act entitled an act to amend and establish Judicial circuits, and prescribe the times and places of holding courts,

Which were signed by the Speaker, and sent to the Senate for the signature of the President thereof.
