

I am instructed to inform the House of Representatives, that the Senate have concurred in the two first resolutions of the House respecting the Mormon disturbances, and made an amendment to the third, to which they ask the concurrence of the house.

They have passed a resolution as additional to the above mentioned resolution which is herewith submitted for the concurrence of the house.

Resolved, By the Senate the House of Representatives concurring therein that the foregoing resolutions be referred to the joint committee of the two houses hereto raised on the subject of the Mormon difficulties, with instructions to report a bill in conformity thereto, as soon as they conveniently can prepare the same and have filled the blank in the third resolution with the word two.

The Senate have also passed a memorial to Congress relative to Field notes, which is herewith submitted for the concurrence of the House.

The report of the committee of the whole House upon the bill entitled, an act to establish a second branch of the Bank of the State of Missouri was under consideration,

And the report of the committee of the whole as amended was agreed to.
