Dr Sir

I am informed that you have a small job of printing at your disposal, in reference to the late Mormon difficulty, and that you will give it to me provided we can agree as to the price

I propose to print the required number of copies (2000) for \$9.50cts per page of 1500 ems small picas, fold, stitch, and deliver them at your office if required.

I could afford to do the work cheaper if it contained more pages, but as it will contain a small number of pages, it seems to me that it cannot be done for less than \$9.50 cents per page

I was paid \$9.00 per page for printing the Decisions of the Supreme Court, and that work contained 600 pages, and there were but 1500 copies to print

You will please inform me as soon as convenient whether you accede to my proposition, as I am ready

at any time to commence the work

I need not tell you that a favor, however small, will be thankfully received. Times are dull, money scarce, and but little prospect of a change for the better
