William Splawn a witness produced sworn and examined on behalf the state deposes and saith I was at Eli Baglys in Daries County when an armed company of men about 100 or 12 in number James St Paulins and Jesse J Hunter two of the defendants were of the company came to Baglys they enquired who I was and if I was a mob character and learning I was not they let me alone they enquired for John Raglin and said they heard he was a mob character and had gone for men to fight them and if they got their eyes on him they would take his life & that he had better keep out of the way to prevent that Hunter was of the company I will not say I had a little or no doubt of it from his appearance this was on Saturday after I learned that Gallatin was burned the Thursday before and during the time the Mormon troops were in Daries County and further this deponent saith not

Thomas M Odell a witness produced sworn and examined on behalf the state deposes and saith, that on the Saturday after Gallatin was burned an armed company of 12 men rode up to Mr Raglin's house in Daries County where I resided, they enquired for John Raglin, I told them where he had gone, they said their object was to drive the mob from the County and said that I must go, I replied I could not, that I had no way to get off and that my family was barred, they replied that made no difference I must go, and said if I was not gone by next morning by sunrise they would take my life, they told Mrs Raglin she must just sit it, that there she could not stay and that Raglin had better never shear himself there that they would take his life if ever they set their eyes on him next
