# Missouri voting and Elections

---

## Who registers to vote in Missouri?

Citizens living in Missouri must register in order to vote. Any U.S. citizen 17 and one-half years of age or older, if a Missouri resident, may register and vote except:

- A person who is adjudged incapacitated
- A person who is confined under sentence of imprisonment
- A person who is on probation or parole after conviction of a felony until finally discharged
- A person after conviction of a felony or misdemeanor connected with the right of suffrage (RSMo 115.133)

## How do Missourians register?

Qualified citizens may register in person at the office of their local election authority, by mail, at the driver's license fee office or at participating state agencies. Registration in person is accomplished by filling out a registration form with information on identity, residence and qualifications, which are signed, sworn to and then witnessed by the election authority or a designee. (RSMo 115.155)

Registration by mail, at the driver's license fee office or at the participating state agencies requires submission of an application stating qualifications. The election authority within seven working days sends a verification or rejection of registration. (RSMo 115.159)

## When do Missourians register?

An unregistered citizen may register to vote whenever local election authorities' places of business are open, by requesting an application by mail from the election authority, when renewing a Missouri driver's license or when receiving services from a participating state agency. Special registration sites may be utilized prior to major elections.

The deadline for registration is the fourth Wednesday prior to an election. Individuals who have moved to Missouri after the registration deadline may register and vote a truncated ballot.

Missouri holds elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in: February, March, April, June, August and November. In even-numbered years, the primary election is held in August and the general election is held in November. Also, Missouri holds a presidential preference primary in March during a presidential election year. Other elections are held in Missouri pursuant to the charters of certain cities and counties and writs of election issued by the Governor.

## Who conducts registration and elections?

Voter registration and the conduct of elections are the responsibilities of boards of election commissioners in the counties of Clay, Jackson, Platte and St. Louis and in the cities of Kansas City and St. Louis. The county clerk serves as the election authority in all other counties of the state.

## Special voting provisions

Handicapped voters and persons prevented from voting because of absence or illness may vote absentee. Persons with permanent disabilities may apply for permanent absentee ballot status by making application with the local election authority. (115.284 RSMo) Voters requiring additional assistance may opt for curbside voting, or voters may be transferred to more accessible precincts. Local election officials should be contacted about absentee federal service balloting or "new resident" ballots for residents who arrive after the registration deadline.

## Elections and political parties

Missourians do not register under party affiliation. Hence, at primary elections, voters may choose which "established party" ballot they wish to vote. Party nominees—and independent candidates—are then listed on the general election ballot.

There are presently three "established political parties" statewide—the Republican, Democratic and Libertarian parties. Persons may seek the nomination of these parties for any elective office from the county level and above. In order to become "established", a party must have received more than two percent of the votes cast statewide for at least one of its candidates. New parties are formed by petition and may exist on the county, district or state level. They must meet the same standard as any other party to remain "established."

In addition to the three statewide established parties, the Constitution, Reform, Green and Natural Law parties are also active in some regions of the state.

At the time of primary elections, voters select county committee members of established parties in Missouri. Those committee people, thus elected, have certain duties and responsibilities. They serve, as appropriate, as members of legislative, senatorial, judicial, and congressional district committees. County, district, or state committee members may be called on to fill candidate vacancies on party ballots or to select nominees for special elections from time to time. The state committees are selected, indirectly, by local committee persons. The state committees become especially important when delegates to presidential nominating (national) conventions are being selected.
